

To the residents of Pictou East,

By the time you read this, I sincerely hope Nova Scotians will already be seeing cases drop as we beat back at the third wave. I know we can do it.

Folks, I know the last year has been difficult. This pandemic has tested us in so many ways. It has been incredibly challenging for our families, for our businesses, for our students, our essential workers, healthcare workers and our seniors living in long-term care facilities.

Please know that every community, every Nova Scotian, is working together to flatten the curve to make sure our businesses get back to running at full capacity - that our seniors can see their loved ones again - and that our essential workers can breathe a sigh of relief.

I am extremely grateful for how the residents of Pictou East have risen to the occasion and supported one another during these trying times. Whether it was picking up groceries for a neighbour or supporting our local businesses; there were acts of kindness all around us and they gave us hope to carry on.

During the Spring Session of the Legislature, I asked about the Aberdeen Hospital and how it has not had a short-stay unit since it was temporarily closed in 2015.

Residents in Pictou County will know that for too many people the needed support has not been there. This has left those in need to seek support in the emergency room which we know isn't the best place for someone in a mental health crisis or Truro, Antigonish or elsewhere in the province.

Access to mental health service has always been important, but with the pressures of the pandemic, it is the best line of defence for those individuals going through times of incredible challenge. Anyone who is brave enough to ask for help should get it.

I wish I had better news, but as of this writing, there are no plans from the Minister of Health and Wellness to reopen this unit.

My colleagues and I have put forward mental health solutions and released a plan titled Universal Mental Health Care plan. One aspect of the plan would see the removal of the two-tiered system so that private psychiatrists could be brought under the public banner to ensure help is there for those who need it. We are committed to making access to mental healthcare barrier-free, friendly and available.

There are currently 6,910 residents of Pictou County on the Need a Family Practice Registry. If you do not have a family doctor or a nurse practitioner, please add yourself to the registry. We have a plan to fix healthcare but we need to know the real numbers.

As your MLA, I will continue to advocate for healthcare supports and resources for our community.

During the sitting of the Legislature, I also had the opportunity to recognize and thank community members who volunteer, selflessly give back, and make our part of the province so special. When it's safe to do, I can't wait to hit the road to visit you.

My door is always open and ready to serve the constituents of Pictou East. Whether we're serving residents in person or virtually, we strive on getting back to you in a timely manner.

If you know of a community group or perhaps a neighbour who goes above and beyond to make the East River Valley better we want to hear from you! Share your stories, give someone a pat on the back!




Online Learning
