
#### **Notes from the Chair-David Wilson**

Jackie taught them to march for their rights and later showed them her love through hard work and punishing shifts at Canada Post to keep food on the table. Her children and grandchildren knew her unconditional love

through big hugs and maybe a little too much ice cream. Retirement gave her the opportunity to move to Hopewell with Marion to be closer to the grandchildren. She watched them grow with joy. She was a founding member of the Halifax Women's Housing Co-op, a member of the women's OWL's group of Halifax, the Birthday Club of Pictou County and served as Vice President of the East River Valley Community Development Association. Jackie loved reading science fiction, woodworking, and gardening. Friends have said she could grow a garden from concrete. She shed a ray of light on everyone she met and will be missed by her many friends. 


Our cookie decorating box fundraiser was a delicious success.

We would like to extend a big thank you to our neighbours at Gennoe's Public Baking and Supplies for their generous donation of flour and icing sugar.



#### Fire Fighters 50-50

Nova Scotia's Volunteer Fire Departments have gotten together to form Canada's largest weekly Cash Draw through Rafflebox. This 50-50 draw has been running for 62 weeks, with prizes in excess of \$100,000 per week, and as big as over \$200,000 for last Christmas and New Years draws.

Tickets are 1 for \$5, 3 for \$10, 20 for \$20, or 100 for \$50, and can be purchase through Rafflebox at

There is a drop down list to Select a Member, where you can select which fire department you want to support, and 35 cents from each dollar you spend on tickets goes to that department. If you win the jackpot, an additional \$1000 goes to the fire department you are supporting.

There have been 2 winners from the Pictou County area in the past couple of months. You could be next to win a life changing pot of money, while helping to support your local Volunteer Fire Department.

The odds are much better than the lotteries, and the weekly prize is substantial!

### Pictou County Volunteer Fire Department Equalization Funding

There are 17 Volunteer Fire Departments in Pictou County, each receiving funding through our Municipal Tax and Fire Tax Levy rates. The total income of each department depends on the number and value of properties and businesses in each district. While some areas are populated with many high value properties and businesses, others have a low population and no industry making up their tax base. As a result, some departments are well funded, and of the 17, five are severely under funded. Three of the 5 underfunded departments are within District 11, which includes the East River Valley FD, Blue Mountain FD and East River St. Mary's FD.

An Audit was conducted in 2019/2020, and the findings indicated that the minimum income a Volunteer Fire Department could reasonably operate with is \$90,000 per year, to cover the cost of equipment, training, gear and to save for major purchases such as trucks.

A committee that included both Fire Chiefs and Council members proposed a solution to redistribute funds to ensure that the 5 underfunded departments would be brought up to the minimum funding level as indicated by the audit. This "Abercrombie proposal" was approved by Council at the June 7 meeting, and will bring the 5 underfunded departments up to the required level through 2 measures. First, each of the 5 underfunded departments will have their Fire Tax Levy increased to 20 cents on the dollar, and second the 12 well funded departments will have 5% of their Fire Tax Levy redistributed to the 5 underfunded departments, to bring each up to the \$90,000.

While the 5 departments who require increased funding are hoping for an equitable solution, this decision has not been well received by all. Currently, there are departments who are seeking legal advice regarding the redistribution of their Fire Tax Levy dollars to other departments.




