



East River Valley Community Kiosks

We are lucky to have community kiosks depicting the rich history of the East River Valley in Churchville, Sunnybrae, Hopewell and Eureka. These kiosks have been part of the community for 15+ years.

With regular wear and tear and unfortunately some vandalism, these kiosks are in need of major repairs and replacements.

The ERVCDA are exploring the cost associated with replacing panels at the kiosks, though we know this will be an expensive project.

If anyone has any great ideas on ways to fundraise for this work, or other ways we could have these kiosks back to their former glory, we would welcome all suggestions.

Hopewell Footbridge

The historic Hopewell Footbridge was built in the 1800's and is one of the last surviving footbridges in North America. In 1991 a large effort was made to restore the bridge. Unfortunately, over time the bridge has been a target of vandalism by both humans and woodpeckers, causing significant damage to the structure.

Engineers have looked at the bridge, and it is not going to be an easy or inexpensive fix.

Someone needs to step up to save this bridge, before it's too late and we lose this piece of history forever.

Pancakes for Breakfast!

Pancakes are our favourite breakfast at home. Mom usually makes them Sunday mornings. I started making pancakes by myself this summer. I would like to share the recipe I use with you.

250 mL of flour (we use white, but you can try another)
5 mL baking powder
10mL of sugar
A pinch of salt
15mL of melted butter (I think mom uses more, but this is what she told me)
250mL milk
1 egg

Mix all the dry ingredients together then add the liquid ingredients and mix those in. Mom recommends adding the milk first, egg second and melted butter last.

Scoop the batter into a warm griddle or frying pan. Mom says medium-low heat and showed me that's three on our stove. To scoop, I use the cup I measure the milk with to save dirty dishes.

I fill the cup halfway with batter then add it to the pan.

You flip the pancakes when you see bubbles on the top of the pancake.

Some things I learned:

You can double the recipe. Just multiply the amounts in the list by 2. Mom does that and I warm the leftover pancakes in the toaster for breakfast before the school bus comes. There are different kinds of sugar! Mom uses brown sugar or maple sugar. I want to try using honey sometime.

Residents of the East River Valley will soon be able access to high-speed wireless internet through the Municipality of Pictou County's FirstHome internet project.

In response to demand from the community, the MOPC has been establishing a high-speed wireless network throughout the county. This network will help meet the immediate needs of people who live and work here, while the MOPC continues construction of its fibre network.

The wireless network includes 17 towers of which three are in the East River Valley – Sunnybrae, Bridgeville, and Churchville.

Customers are being tested on all these towers now and in the coming weeks, the service will be offered to all interested residents in those areas.

With wireless internet, a signal is sent from the tower to an antenna in your home or business. The MOPC uses both line-of-sight and non-line-of-sight wireless technologies, which gives the capability to push the signal through some wooded areas. Speeds start at 25 Mbps download and 5 Mbps upload. Your signal will be tested before the service is connected to ensure adequate signal strength.

The wireless internet is being offered directly through the MOPC and will be \$49.99 a month plus tax with no contract and no usage cap. To sign up for the wireless internet service you can call 1-833-727-2256. You can also register online at mopcfirsthome.net.
